Professor of Finance, University of Sydney Business School

Susan Thorp is a Professor of Finance at the University of Sydney Business School and was recently appointed as the Associate Dean (Research) for 2019. Susan researches household and consumer finance with a particular focus on retirement savings and decumulation, and has published over 40 papers in international academic journals. She has led and participated in grant projects attracting over \$3 million dollars in public and industry funding. Susan is also a regular contributor to consumer finance and superannuation policy discussions, and her research is cited by major public reviews and inquiries.
